To reflect increasing costs, we have made the difficult decision to increase the cost of school dinners from £2.44 to £2.50 per meal.

# **School Attendance**

The impact upon children's education through lost learning is huge, so it is vital that we make every school minute count. We urge you to ensure that your child is in school and on time every day to prevent them from falling behind with their learning.

Government departments track school attendance figures. It is considered that attendance of 90% or below is persistent absence which will trigger further action by school. Failing to improve on this 90% can lead to prosecution, which we want to help families avoid. Good attendance is considered to be at or above 94%.

#### What YOU must do:

- Telephone the school (01626 353282) or email admin@decoyschool.co.uk before 8.30am each day of your child's absence. We ask that you are specific about the reason for the absence e.g. rather than saying that your child is ill, tell us that they have been sick/have a high temperature/have a bad cold etc.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters if possible.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport or if you are unwell, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help!
- Talk to your child about the importance of them being in school and let them know how important you feel it is.
- Ensure that your child arrives at school on time (if they arrive after the register has closed (9:00am), your child is marked as absent for the morning session).

# What WE will do:

- Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

#### **Holidays and Other Requests for Absence**

Schools are only allowed by law, to authorise non-medical absences if requested in advance by a parent with whom the pupil normally resides. A school can only authorise such a request if they are satisfied that there are "exceptional circumstances" which apply. However, even if there are exceptional circumstances, schools can still consider any other relevant factors such as previous attendance rates; the ability of the pupil to catch-up on missed work; the wider impact of missing the specified period of time.

Devon County Council's advice is that schools must be extremely cautious about approving such requests if the pupil's education is likely to be significantly impacted upon.

Parents should ensure that they know whether the absence will be authorised or not before they go away as an unauthorised absence will likely result in a penalty notice or court summons being issued to each parent for each pupil affected. It is therefore recommended that this completed form is sent into the school at least three school weeks before the intended absence.


Attendance in school is measured on a rolling twelve-month basis, not on a single academic year. Periods of unauthorised absence are cumulative over this 12-month period. Ten or more

unauthorised sessions (equivalent to 5 days), could result in a penalty notice being issued by the local authority.
